

## The GEA Fund 2016-2019

The international Gender & Education Association (GEA) is launching a Fund to support its membership to develop networks and undertake small research projects.

We are committing to a three-year programme of annual funding calls – each with a specific focus.

*Criteria that will be applied to each funding call include:*

- All applicants must be GEA members
- All proposals must include a timeline of activities
- Proposals must also include a breakdown and justification of the project costings
- All funded proposals will be need to produce materials to be shared on the GEA website (<http://www.genderandeducation.com>) (blogs, articles, resources etc.)

### June 2016 - July 2017

The first funding call focuses on developing national or international networks of feminist scholars, practitioners and/or activists to discuss and develop dissemination activities and/or policy interventions in areas related to promoting and problematising knowledge on gender and education in different contexts.

- Each network could be funded up to a maximum of £2,000
- The total amount available for this funding call is £6000

### Criteria applied by GEA when assessing applications received

- Ensure a range of issues/interests are covered across the proposals funded
- Ensure at least one funded proposal is from the Global South
- It is desirable that proposals seeking to develop a national network aim to involve international colleagues as appropriate and consider how their deliberations and outputs might be relevant to an international community of scholars

### Timeline

- Submit proposals to [contact@genderandeducation.com](mailto:contact@genderandeducation.com) by 16 September 2016
- GEA to inform colleagues who have submitted a proposal of the outcome by 30 September

In your proposal please set out the rationale for your application, develop a number of outcomes you will work towards and the timeline.

From September 2017-August 2018, the funding call will focus on applications for small scale projects that support GEA members to undertake some pilot work which could feed into a larger research bid they would like to develop. Currently, we have allocated up to £4,000 of GEA funds for this call.

From September 2018-August 2019, the funding call will focus on applications for small scale projects that support GEA early career researchers. Currently, we have allocated up to £4,000 of GEA funds for this call. Mentorship from a member of the GEA Executive Committee will be offered to successful applicants, who will, amongst other things, support them to prepare at least one paper for the Gender & Education journal.
